This report examines the history of the adult literacy movement in the U.K. during the post-war period. For policy makers and researchers, the major finding is that literacy practices and literacy needs are multiple and vary according to context, so that single solutions cannot be packaged and transported to different sites. Although written about British adult literacy, the analysis provides insights and perspectives relevant to adult literacy in North America.
